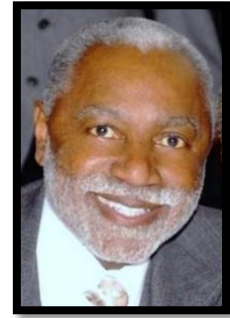


About Dr. Nathan Butler

While there is widespread hunger, food preservation in the excellent season has sustainability in a weak harvest and drought.
